



#### I. THE COLLEGE

#### A. Location

Nabinchandra College is situated in the heart of Badarpur, an important town in Karimganj district of Southern Assam. Badarpur, being located in the centre of Barak valley and also being the meeting point of Cachar, Hailakandi and Karimganj districts, enjoys an enviable location in this valley. Besides, it is the gateway to Barak valley and is well connected with the three lifelines of this valley, namely rail, road and river. The heart enchanting hills of Panchgram, the distant blue hills of Meghalaya, the ever green surroundings with trees in bloom, paddy fields, ponds and a busy national highway in front have lent an idyllic view and provided urban facilities at the same time.

#### B. History

The beautiful and well-built Nabinchandra College that stands impressively in the heart of Badarpur town had its beginning in the late 1960s. The people of those years faced many a problem in sending their children for higher education to Karimganj or Silchar as there was no college between these two towns lying fifty-five kilometres apart. Distance, wastage of time & money, poor communication facilities were the chief hurdles which made them think about an alternative arrangement. The result was the unanimous decision of setting up a college at Badarpur. This noble idea soon acquired flesh and bones through the selfless and untiring efforts of the people of all walks of life in the form of a college on August 2 1969. The sweat and blood of the then staff, students and the general public helped in laying a strong foundation and in nurturing the new born educational institution.

As the college had no campus of its own, the classes of only Arts stream were run in a rented building in a very close to the present site. The college was christened "Nabinchandra College" in 1971 after the late father of Basanta Kumar Das, a major donor from Karimganj town. It was shifted to the present site in 1974 and was brought under the deficit system of grants-in-aid rules of the Assam government in 1975. Since then it never looked back & always marched forward, crossing many a hurdle on the road to progress, achieving side by side the physical development of the college and the academic growth of the institution.

The College introduced **Commerce** at H.S. level in 1981 and at degree level in 1984, which continued till 1989. After a gap of six years, the College re-introduced the Commerce Stream in 1996. At present It is a full fledged vivrant stream with two honours courses viz 1. Accounting and Finance and 2. Business Management.

In the session 2006-07, the college introduced Science Stream at degree level & in 2008-09 at the H.S. level. At present it is a full fledged vivrant stream with honours courses in Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry. Further, it is the only institution in Assam offering honours in Ecology & Environment al Science

N.C. College, Badarpur is one of the five colleges of Assam & the only college under Assam University selected by DHE, Assam to offer Bachelor Degree in Vocational Course (BVoc) in Information Technology w.e. from the session 2017-18

The college is a TDC Examination Zune of Assam University, Silchar and has been working successfully since the session 2014-15.

The College has recognised need to introduce Career oriented programmes at U.G. Level and accordingly has introduced in 2004-05 a course in **Functional Arabic** sponsored by **NCPUL**, **under H.R.D Ministry**, **New Delhi**. In 2006-07 Session, the college has introduced U.G.C. sponsored Career Oriented programmes in **Computer Application in Business**, **Marketing Management and Entrepreneurship Development**. A correspondence course centre under the Institute of Distance and Open learning (IDOL) of Gauhati University had been functioning in this college for many years. The latest addition in the academic expansion is the joining of Nabinchandra College as a Partner Institute of Indira Gandhi

National Open University (IGNOU) under its convergence scheme to offer different conventional and specialised courses to the people of Badarpur and adjacent areas which worked many years. However, the same is not working presently due to general decission of IGNOU.

The college has, over the years, made significant progress on academic front— diversification of subjects and streams, increase in the intake capacity of the students, increase in the number of faculty members, upgrading the library facilities, laboratory facilities, considerable improvement in infrastructure and teaching-learning process.

#### C. Vision & Mission

- Impart quality education to the leaners in different branches of Arts, Commerce, Science & B.Voc.
- 2. Disseminate knowledge to the youth irrespective of caste, creed, race, sex and religion.
- 3. Inspire & promote the education of the local youth particularly women and backward classes.
- 4. Promote physical, mental and moral growth of the youth with human values in order to enable them to face the complex challenges of life.
- 5. Foster the spirit of liberal humanism, tolerance, national integration, brotherhood and fellow feelings among the students in particular and the society in general, and to do all such things as may be condusive to the welfare of the students and the community at large.
- 6. Act for all such things which are ancillary or incidental to the attainment of all or any of the above-mentioned subjects, or which may be deemed conducive to the interests of the college.

#### II. NAAC ACCREDITATION

The NAAC or the National Assessment and Accreditation Council, Bangalore is an autonomous body set up by the UGC (University Grants Commission) in 1994 to develop higher education (i.e. College and University education) in India. With this purpose a Peer Team consisting of three educational experts from various Universities visited Nabinchandra College on 20th and 21st August, 2004 and assessed it. The college, as a result, has been accredited with Grade B. The NAAC accreditation is a very significant development in the history of this college.

As a post-accreditation quality development measure, the college constituted Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) to improve its higher education. Since quality improvement is a continuous process, the IQAC is a part of the system of this institution and is working towards realizing its goals of quality sustenance and enhancement. The first co-ordinator of IQAC was Dr. Rajat Bhattacharya (Former HOD, English) and at present Shri Soumitra Choudhury, Asstt. Prof. in the Deptt. of Economics is the Co-ordinator of the IQAC.

One positive benefit of the post-accreditation quality development measure for the college is the reaccreditation of the college by the NAAC with Grade B (CGPA 2.72). The reaccreditation came as a result of the NAAC Peer Team visit to the college that took place on January 31 and February 1, 2011. The college is keen to sustain its qualitative growth and preparing for third cycle of NAAC accreditation.

# III. RULES AND REGULATIONS

The success of an educational institution depends, to a great extent, on the maintenance of discipline and the observance of rules and regulations of the institution. Keeping this as well as the smooth running of this college in view, the students are asked to strictly obey the following rules and regulations.

#### A. ADMISSION

The Candidates interested to take admission in ANY CLASS / SEMESTER of ANY COURSE shall have to submit **ONLINE APPLICATION** only by login the website nccollege.ac.in and get a print copy

of the ON LINE APPLICATION FORM and submit the same along with the self attested xerox copies of all the documents required with cash less payment of Rs 200/- (for New) and Rs. 150/- (for students already registered in a course) as application fee and price of prospectus.

The selection of candidates for admission will be made as per guidelines and strictly on the basis of merit. The College authority reserves the right to accept or reject any application without assigning any reason for the greater interest of the college.

#### Educational qualification for admission to different courses

#### Higher Secondary Courses in Arts, Commerce and Science:

Candidates must have passed H.S.L.C. Examination or its equivalent from a recognised institution. Any break in studies after passing H.S.L.C. or equivalent examination must be supported by a "GAP Certificate" issued as per specified proforma by an appropriate authority.

#### T.D.C. First Semester Pass Course in Arts:

Candidates must have passed H.S. Final Examination or its equivalent from a recognised institution.

#### T.D.C. First Semester Pass Course in Commerce:

Candidates must have passed H.S. Final Examination in Commerce or its equivalent from a recognised institution.

# T.D.C. First Semester Pass Course in Science:

Candidates must have passed H.S. Final Examination in Science or its equivalent from a recognised institution.

## T.D.C. First Semester B.Voc in Information Technology:

Candidates must have passed H.S. Final Examination from any stream or its equivalent from a recognised institution.

#### **Honours Course:**

A student offering Honours course in any Arts subject should have a good academic record with not less than 50% marks in the concerned subject in the qualifying examination. A student offering Honours course in Economics, besides fulfilling above-mentioned condition, should have atleast 40% marks in Mathematics in the H.S.L.C./ H.S. Examination.

A student intending to take Honours in Commerce subjects must have 50 % marks in Accountancy and Business Studies in the qualifying examination. Preference will be given to the students who have Commercial Mathematics & Statistics (CMS) in H.S.

A student intending to take Honours in B.Sc Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics and Ecoloogy & Environmental Science must have 50% marks in the concerned subjects in the qualifying examintion. Students offering Honours may have to undergo a written test. Students with unsatisfactory

performance in the test will not be allowed to continue with honours subjects.

Admission in all courses (H.S. & TDC in Arts, Commerce and Science) will be strictly on the basis of merit, availability of seats. Intake capacity in honours course is 30 per subjects.

#### C. EXAMINATION

#### H.S. First Year Examination:

The H.S.-I examination will be conducted at the end of the First Year classes as per the guidelines of A.H.S.E.C. The papers include :

1. English : One paper of 100 marks. (Theory 90 + Practical 10)

2. MIL/Alt.English : One paper of 100 marks

3. Three Elective Subjects : One paper of 100 marks each

4. Environmental Education : One paper of 50 marks. (Theory 40 + Assignment 10)

#### H.S. Final Year Examination:

At the end of second year classes, the final examinations are held in February/March every year. The papers include:

English : One paper of 100 marks.
 MIL/Alt.English : One paper of 100 marks
 Three Elective Subjects : One paper of 100 marks

## Examinations conducted by Assam University, Silchar

### Semester System:

TDC Course is of three years duration having six semesters. Odd Semester examinations are usually held in November - December and Even Semester Examinations are held in April-May.

#### College Examinations:

Students will have to appear at all examinations that may be conducted by the college for H.S. and B.Voc Courses.

#### D. DRESS CODE

- 1. Uniform must be of the specified colour.
- 2. Low-waist shirt and tight dress will not be allowed
- 3. Shoes / Sandals / Belts must be either black or Brown.

#### E. GENERAL DISCIPLINE

- 1. Students must come and leave the college in time.
- 2. Students must not loiter in the veranda and cause disturbance to teachers and students in the classroom. They must spend their off periods productively in the reading room or in their respective common rooms.
- 3. Students must wear proper uniform in the college.
- 4. Students must show respect to and behave politely with the principal, the teachers and the other staff of the college.
- 5. Students must maintain the sanctity of the classroom, examination hall and the library.

- 6. Smoking, chewing betel leaf and such other activities by students are strictly prohibited in the college campus.
- 7. Tuition fee and other fees must be cleared before the time fixed for the purpose.
- 8. No one except the officers on duty and the present staff and students of this college is allowed to enter the classroom without the permission of the college authority. Any student of this college who entertains such people will be liable to disciplinary action.
- 9. Any damage caused to college property (furniture, doors and windows, library books, equipment, sports materials etc.) must be compensated by the concerned student
- 10. Students are required to submit a clearance certificate to the effect that no dues are outstanding against library books, sports materials, returnable NCC uniform items etc., failing which they will be debarred from the council/university examinations OR they might face any other disciplinary action.
- 11. Students are entirely responsible for their behaviour in the college campus and outside when they are deputed by the college to participate in any programme.
- 12. Use of mobile phones in any manner is strictily prohibited inside the college campus.
- 13. Ragging in any form is a punishable offence (according to Supreme Court of India)
- 14. Bi-cycles and Motor Cycles are to be parked only in the specified areas.
- 15. Library Reading Room should be used strictly for reading purpose. Any sort of gossiping is strictly prohibited in the Reading Room.
- 16. College Campus must not be made dirty by spitting or any other means.

Students are required to strictly abide by the rules and regulations as prescribed by the college authorities for the smooth and peaceful functioning of the college.

All powers relating to discipline and disciplinary action in relation to the students of the college are vested in the principal. He may delegate any of his powers to such other person as he may nominate for this purpose. At the time of admission, every student shall be required to sign a declaration that he/she will abide by the rules and regulations of the college and will do nothing that will go against the interest of the college. Violation of the rules, unsatisfactory progress, irregular attendance, discourtesy shown to the principal, teachers and other staff members in any form, adoption of unfair means in the examinations, and causing damage to college property are some of the offences which may make a student liable to disciplinary action in such forms as imposition of fine, forced transfer and even expulsion from the college.

#### C. COURSE STRUCTURE

1. H.S. Arts (The First year / Second year)

#### COMPULSORY SUBJECTS:

A candidate of the H.S Programme of the Council will offer subjects as specified below:

- (i) English- 100 marks.
- (ii) Modern Indian Language / Alternative English 100 marks.
- (iii) Environmental Education 50 marks only in H.S. 1st year.

#### **ELECTIVE SUBJECTS:**

- i. Three elective subjects from the following (a) Economics (b) History (c) Political Science (d) Arabic (e) Advance Bengali 100 marks each
- ii. In addition to three elective subjects, a candidate may have the option to offer a fourth elective subject of 100 marks belonging to the same stream.

#### 2. H.S.Commerce (The First year / Second year)

Students of Commerce stream will take the following subjects:

#### **COMPULSORY SUBJECTS:**

- (i) English 100 marks.
- (ii) Modern Indian Language (MIL) / Alternative English 100 marks.
- (iii) Environmental Education 50 marks only in H.S. 1st year.

#### **ELECTIVE SUBJECTS:**

- (i) Accountancy (ii) Business studies
- (iii) Economics And or Commercial Mathematics & Statistics. (CMS) Students are advised to take both Economics and CMS as both the Subjects are important for higher studies.

#### 3. H.S.Science

Students of Science stream will take the following subjects:

# Compulsory subjects:

- (i) English 100 marks.
- (ii) Modern Indian Language (MIL) / Alternative English 100 marks.
- (iii) Environmental Education 50 marks only in H.S. 1st year.

#### **ELECTIVE SUBJECTS:**

- (i) Physics
- (ii) Chemisrty
- (iii) Mathematics And or Biology.
- N.B. Students can opt for any one of the following languages as MIL: Assamese, Bengali, Bodo, Hindi, Nepali, Urdu, Khasi, Garo, Mizo and Manipuri.

The college teaches only one Modern Indian Language, that is, Bengali.

Candidates offering MIL other than Bengali have to make their own arrangement for instruction in those

subjects. It may be noted that a student cannot opt for both Advance Bengali and Arabic as elective subjects.

#### 4. CURRICULUM FOR B. A., B.Com. & B.Sc.

Students taking admission in TDC 1st Sem B.A/B.Com/ B.Sc course have to study under Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) w.e.f. the current session 2018-19 vide Assam University Notification No. AUK-203/2/2004 dt.21st May 2018. The detail of this system is available in the AUS website www.aus.ac.in

#### GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS & REGULATIONS OF EXISTING SEMESTER SYSTEM:

- 1. Pass Course of 1200 marks and honours course of 1800 (900 in Hons + 900 in pass) Marks in six semesters i.e. in Three Years.
- i) General group of three subjects are compulsory for all students of Arts, Commerce and Science, which are
  - a) General English (first and second semester),
  - b) Modern Indian Language or Alternative English or Business Communication for Commerce (third & fourth semester)
  - c) Foundation Course in Environmental Studies (fifth & sixth semester)
  - ii) Three elective subjects are to be chosen as permissible in the college.
- 3. i) Each theory course paper is of:
  - a) 50 marks (Non practical subjects)
  - b) 35 marks (Practical subjects)
  - ii) Each Practical paper is of
    - a) 30 marks for pass
    - b) 90 marks in each Honours paper.
- 4. Theory Examination: 2 hours duration.

**Practical Examination:** 3-4 hours per day for pass papers and 4-6 hours per day for Honours papers.

# 5. Admission in college for:

- a) 1st semester should be within June.
- b) For other semesters (2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup>) provisional admission must be taken within 7 days after examinations of previous semesters are over and this must be regularised within 7 days of the result of the previous semester is announced.

Special permission for any cause of delay for admission shall not be entertained.

#### Start of Class :

All Classes will start after the admission process is over which will be notified by the college

# 7. Eligibility criteria for admission in examination :

- i) One should have 75% of attendance both in theory and practical papers. 65% attendance may be considered only on special ground as justified and certified by the Principal.
- ii) One should have to qualify in the unit tests securing at least 40% of marks.

#### 8. Promotion Rules:

Promotion rules as decided by AUS AC: 62:05-12:01

- A candidate who has been admitted in first semester class may be allowed to proceed to the next semester (upto 6<sup>th</sup> semester) irrespective of number of papers in which the candidate failed.
- 2) A candidate will get a maximum of Three chances for clearing the back papers within Six years, i.e., 12 semesters from the date of admission to the degree course.
- 3) A candidate will be considered eligible to sit for the sixth semester examinations with not more than six back papers of earlier semester classes excluding 5<sup>th</sup> semester.
- 4) Failing in any semesters examinations, a student will be allowed to appear the same in the following manner:
- i) Odd semester papers with the odd semester examination.
- ii) Even semester papers with the even semester examination.
- 9. i) There will be no provision for repeat or betterment i.e. scope for appearing in any paper again for obtaining better result.
  - ii) A candidate has to clear all the papers within six years or 12 Semester examination duration from the first admission.



# V. FACILITIES

#### A. LIBRARY

The college has a well-improvised library with a good collection of books covering a wide variety of subjects. Library facilities include provision of reading rooms for students and teachers, newspaper-stand, lending of books and other library materials. The library subscribes to a number of periodicals including different subject magazines and 3 to 4 newspapers (National & Local). It also stocks magazines, question papers and information booklets.

Library cards are issued to students to enable them borrow books and other library materials. They can avail library service from 11.00 a.m. to 4.00 p.m. on all working days. A student is allowed to borrow two books at a time for 10 days. Honours students enjoy better borrowing facilities. Students can make use of the reading room which remains open from 11.00 a.m. to 4.00 p.m. for reading books and journals, making notes, reading newspapers etc. The college library is now computerized with standard software provided free by the INFLIBNET centre, Ahmedabad with financial assistance from the UGC. The Library is the member of National Digital Library, IIT. Khargapur. This will help the users access to lakhs of E-Books and E-Journals and also other important documents.

The Library Committee, constituted as per relevant rules, with the principal as chairman and librarian as secretary devises steps and schemes based on recommendations emerging from its meeting for smooth functioning of the library and promotion of library facilities.

#### **B. UGC NETWORK RESOURCE CENTRE:**

The students and staff of this college can avail the internet facility in the centre for academic purposes.

#### C. GAMES AND SPORTS:

Nabinchandra College offers facilities for cricket, football, volleyball, badminton, carrom, chess etc. The college has its own playground in front of the college building in which the annual sports are held. Many more facilities are being procured.

#### D. BOOK-BANK:

The College has started a Book-Bank from where needy students may be supplied with books

#### E. COLLEGE MAGAZINE:

To enable the students publish their creative writings, a college magazine "Nabinjyoti" is brought out annually. Departmental journals will be brought out to encourage creative/critical writings among the students.

#### F. CANTEEN:

The college has canteen facility for refreshment of Students & Teachers.

#### G. GYMNASIUM:

A Yoga and Gymnasium centre has been opened in the college in the year 2006 with a qualified instructor to promote physical and mental welbeing of the students. A student can use the services of the centre with a payment of Rs. 80.00 for one year. Students and employees willing to use the centre for Yoga and Gym training may contact the instructor.

#### H. CAREER & COUNSELLING CELL:

The Co-ordinator and Convener of the Cell is Mr. Bazlur Rahman Khan, Assistant Professor, Deptt. of History. The Cell regularly organizes counseling programmes in different areas of academic, professional and vocational studies. It also provides counseling to students for competitive examinations like Civil Service Examinations and important entrance tests such as CAT for MBA aspirants, etc.

The Career & Counseling Cell has its own library enriched with sorts of books, journals and magazines for competitive and entrance examinations. Further, the cell has also a well sophisticated class room with facilities like projector, audio system. The cell has one Office Assistant name Shamsul Islam on the part time basis. Besides, the Career & Counseling Cell presently running important UGC Schemes & Programmes.

COACHING CLASSES FOR ENTRY IN SERVICES: Under this scheme, the Career & Counseling Cell organized special coaching classes for different competitive exams such as UPSC Civil Service Examination (IAS), APSC Assam Civil Service, Teachers Eligibility (TET), IBPS Officers & Clerical, etc.

**EQUAL OPPORTUNITY CENTRE**: To promote the educational standard of students belonged to marginalized community Short Term Courses - (i) Personality 'Development & Computer Literacy, (ii) Spoken & Written English are organized in the college.

**REMEDIAL COACHING CLASSES**: Special classes are organized for the students of SC/ST/OBC/ Minority & Economically backward communities with special emphasis on the knowledge of concerned subjects and functional languages in the off hours.

#### I. PRIZES AND SCHOLARSHIPS:

Two cash prizes and certificates in the name and style of Late Mahmoda Begum Memorial Prizes are given to the highest mark holders in both H.S. and Degree (Hons.) examinations.

A scholarship in the name and style of Doreen Scholarship has been launched in 2005-2006 academic session for two top scorers of this college (in both general and female categories) in the H.S. examination every year in the following subjects: English, Bengali, Political Science and Economics.

Also, a scholarship in memory of freedom fighter Late Md. Gaazi Sikender Ahmed is awarded to the highest scorer in H.S. Final Exam. with Arabic as a combination and to the highest scorer in Arabic Honours in TDC 1st Sem. Examination.

Another scholarship in the memory of Late Md. Gazi Tufail Ahmed is awarded to any place holder in both H.S. and Degree examinations. This has been introduced with effect from session 2012-13

The College has also introduced one more award in the name and style of N.C. College Award of Excellence which is given to the rank holders in H.S. / Degree final examinations.

#### J. HEALTH CENTRE:

A health centre has been set up with facilities like first-aid and periodic health check-up for the students and other members of the college community. Dr. Swapan Das, M.B.B.S., consultant physician, has signed a MOU with the college authorities to provide support to the centre. Dr. Debangshu Banerjee, M.D. (Hom) has also been Voluntarily offering services on every Saturday.

#### K. AUDITORIUM:

The College has a large well-furnished sound proof auditorium for different function of the college.

#### L. OVERHEAD PROJECTOR:

The college owns an overhead projector. The projector will be a very useful aid in the conduct of different meetings, seminars, workshops etc. in the college.

#### M. SOUND SYSTEM:

The college has sound systems in all the large classrooms.

#### N. DRINKING WATER:

The college has installed a drinking water system in its campus for providing drinking water to the students and the staff. The system has been installed with financial assistance from Barak Valley Cements Ltd., Badarpur.

#### O. GENERATOR:

The college has recently installed a high powered generator to ensure uninterrupted power supply in view of frequent power cuts.

#### P. DEPARTMENTAL LIBRARY:

The college has provided departmental Libraries which are under the supervision of the Head of the different departments.

# VI. STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES

#### A NCC

An NCC Unit (C Coy) has been operating in Nabinchandra College since 1988 under 4 Assam BN NCC Karimganj. Besides regular parade (twice a week), there are occasional camps, trekking etc. notified from time to time by the BN office Karimganj. The total capacity of this NCC Unit now is 160 (100 % Central funded).

Present enrolment fee is Rs.14/-for 1st year cadets, and Rs.4/- for 2nd. Centrally Funded Cadets get refreshment at the rate of Rs.2/- for each period of parade. They get Rs.10/- each as monthly allowance for washing their NCC uniform. The NCC cadets also get major uniform items free. Dr. Sorwar Alom Khan, Assistant Professor, Dept. of Commerce is the Care taking Officer (CTO) of the NCC Unit of this college.

#### B. NSS

The College has an active NSS unit. Bazlur Rahman Khan, Assistant Professor, Dept. of History is the programme officer. Interested students can register themselves as members in consultation with the programme officer.

**C. SCOUTS AND GUIDE:** The College has introduced Scout and Guide Service from this session. The teacher incharge of this service is Dr. Pallab Deb.

# D. CELL FOR COMMUNITY ORIENTATION AND EXTENSION PROGRAMME:
